
## **Neighborhoods and Renting**


## **City Manager Interviews Scheduled**

## Fireworks: NOT for Every Day

The City Commission amended the Municipal Code to allow certain types of fireworks to be discharged during limited holiday hours. This is an exception to the general ban on all fireworks in the City limits without a permit. Violations of the provision will be strictly enforced and may result in fines up to \$500 if convicted.

The discharge of fireworks on July 4th is limited to the following schedule:

## 4th of July Holiday

Between noon July 3<sup>rd</sup> and midnight July 4<sup>th</sup>

Between noon July 4<sup>th</sup> and 1:00am July 5<sup>th</sup>

Between noon July 5<sup>th</sup> and midnight July 6<sup>th</sup>

## **Bozeman Creek Neighborhood Association**

Bozeman Creek Neighborhood Association (BCNA): The BCNA advisory board has drafted bylaws for review. During the last BCNA general meeting, the group voted to make a statement in support of the neighborhood plan amendments and to ask for a moratorium on building in the corridor. JP Pomnichowski presented the group with information about Transfer of Development Rights (TDR). Ted Lange outlined the process and progress of working with land owners in the corridor to assist in securing a trail easement. Bart Manion presented the Edgewater condominium project and answered questions. Chuck Paden gave the group information about the process the residents of Ice Pond Road have been involved with the find a solution to the Zone Map Amendment (ZMA) on the Hugh Reid property. The property is set to be rezoned as Business Park and will be brought into conformance with the 2020 plan.

## **Northeast Neighborhood Association**

The NENA fairgrounds subcommittee met with fairgrounds representatives and County Commissioner Bill Murdock. The discussion focused on a letter drafted and submitted to the County Commission regarding questions about a proposed 6000 seat amphitheater on the fairgrounds property. On Wednesday, June 9<sup>th</sup> from 7-8:30pm in Building 4 of the fairgrounds, the Gallatin County Fair Board will provide information to the community about BRAVO's proposal for an amphitheater to be located within city limits and their long range plans for the fairgrounds. The presentation will focus on answering community-generated questions regarding the proposed amphitheater project and the process for receiving public input. Gallatin County residents are encouraged to attend this meeting to learn about the project and how to become involved. ## **Northwest Network**

A secret ballot vote conducted by the City of Bozeman for residents of N. 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue has concluded and speed humps will not be installed on N. 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue.

Residents of Hunters Way secured enough neighborhood support to participate in the City's traffic calming program. On June 7<sup>th</sup>, the City Commission discussed and voted (5-0) to allow the installation of 4-ways stops at the intersections of Hunters Way and Rose Street and Hunters Way and Annie Street.

## **Southeast Neighborhood Association**

During the May 18<sup>th</sup> SENA general meeting, residents discussed concerns over increasing issues with rental properties. The attendees agreed to draft letters and emails to the City Commission to outline their concerns. They will also send letters to the President's Office at MSU and local property managers outlining their neighborhood standards.
